Introduction

Hernia Innovation Days 2026 will bring together leading national experts in abdominal wall surgery for two days dedicated to innovation in clinical pathways, surgical approaches, operative techniques and emerging technologies for the treatment of abdominal wall defects. Care pathways, patient selection, centralisation of expertise and patient-reported value

Rationale. Diastasis recti is one of the most debated topics in contemporary abdominal wall surgery. After a phase largely driven by the proliferation of surgical techniques, the next step is the development of appropriate, multidisciplinary and measurable care pathways. Key issues include accurate diagnosis, surgical indication, patient selection, prehabilitation, postoperative rehabilitation, expectation management, patient-reported outcomes and integration with plastic surgery. The round table is designed as the starting point for the launch of a multidisciplinary initiative aimed at developing a Core Outcome Set, a minimum clinical dataset and patient-centred criteria for assessment, treatment appropriateness and referral in rectus diastasis.

Suturing Techniques in Abdominal Wall Surgery

Thursday, 1 October 2026

Format	Pelvic trainers, video demonstrations, individualised feedback and small-group tutoring

Rationale: Modern abdominal wall surgery requires advanced skills in intracorporeal suturing, management of anatomical planes, fascial release, defect closure, and midline reconstruction. The course is designed for residents and early-career surgeons, as well as surgeons beginning a structured training pathway in minimally invasive abdominal wall surgery.

Expected learning outcomes: Each participant will receive a structured technical assessment, an individual debriefing and recommendations for a progressive training pathway in minimally invasive abdominal wall surgery.

Training format: Participants will work in groups of two or three, with one tutor assigned to each training station, rotating through progressively complex open and minimally invasive exercises and advanced reconstructive scenarios.

Learning Objectives:

- Apply the principles of needle handling, traction and countertraction and intracorporeal knotting.
- Perform a structured fascial closure and midline reconstruction.
- Compare the ergonomics, advantages and limitations of different suturing techniques and approaches.
- Recognise technical errors that may compromise tissue perfusion, closure integrity or reconstructive stability.
- Use a structured checklist for self-assessment and progressive skills development.

Rationale: Outpatient inguinal hernia surgery represents a concrete solution to the need to balance clinical appropriateness, patient safety, reduced hospitalisation, organisational sustainability, and resource optimisation. The course addresses this topic not merely as a reduction in the care setting, but as a selective, structured, and measurable pathway.

Expected learning outcomes: Participants will be able to define patient-selection criteria, distinguish the appropriate care setting, design a standardised perioperative pathway, identify minimum organisational requirements, and select relevant quality and safety indicators.

Learning Objectives:

- Define clinical, anesthetic, and social selection criteria.
- Distinguish between outpatient surgery, day surgery, and inpatient admission.
